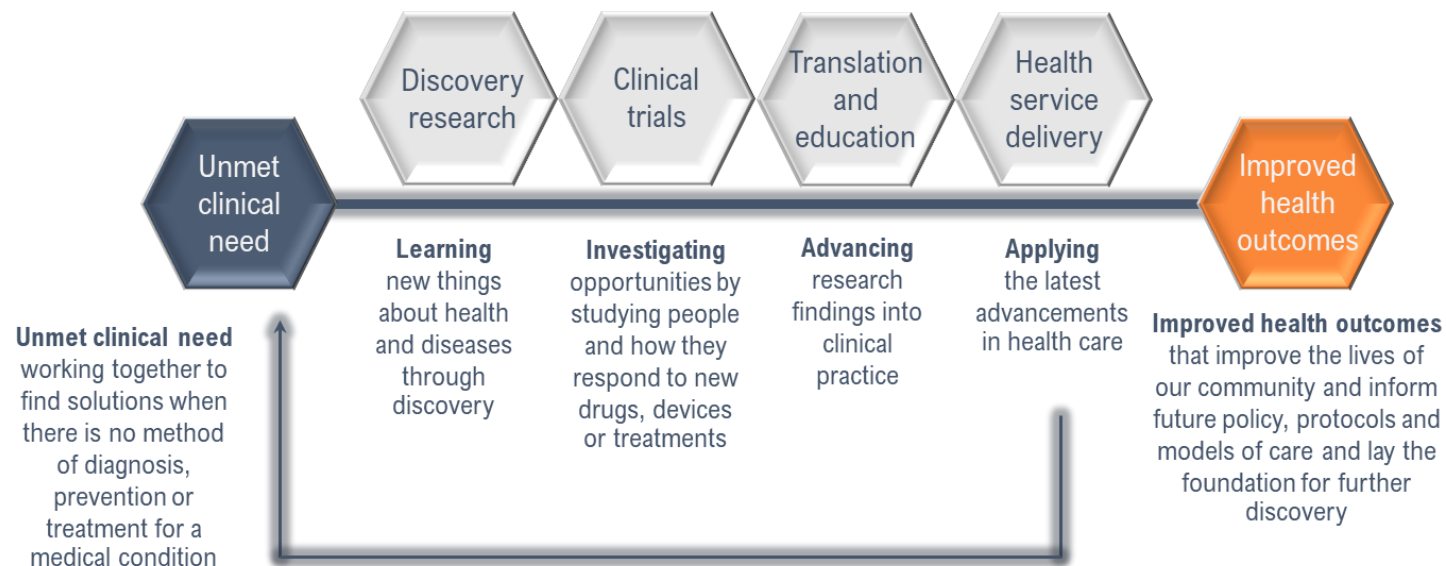

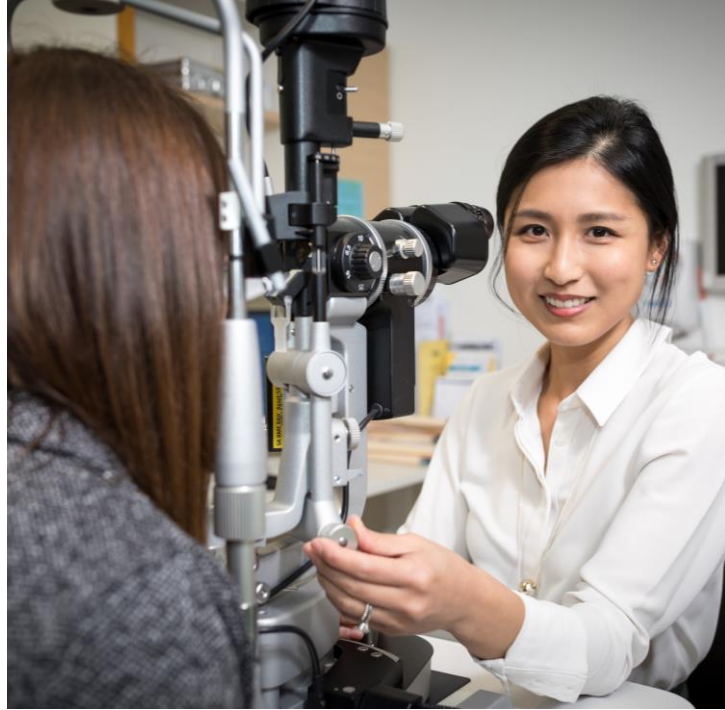

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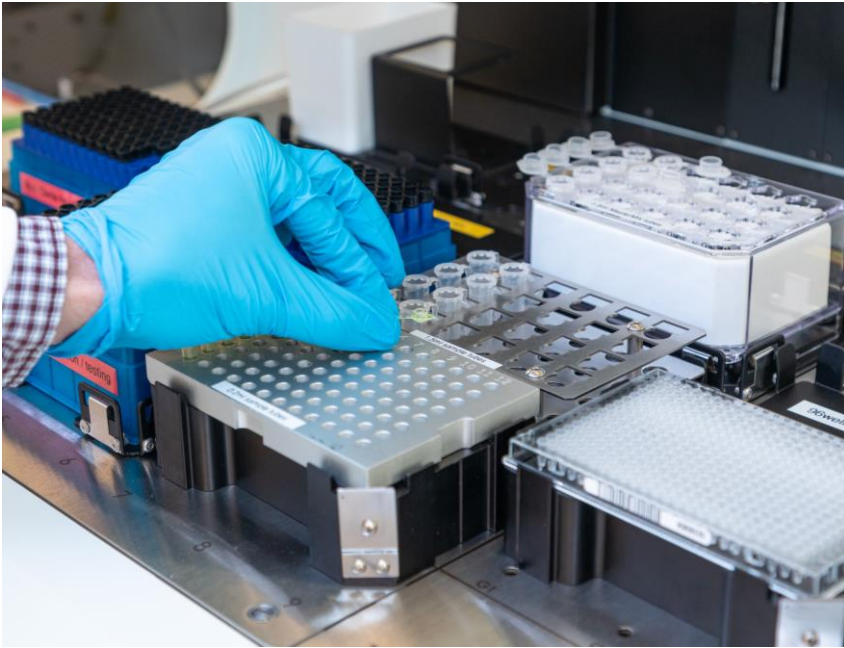
Work together to **use and translate data** to embed data-driven decision making in research and clinical care

SHORT-TERM GOAL BY 2023

- Facilitate and support consent for patients to participate in clinical trials
- 1% of patients participate in a clinical trial
- A workforce strategy establishes shared career progression pathways to grow our talent
- All researchers have access to a transparent and efficient model to conduct research and clinical trials
- Work in partnership to develop a commercialisation pathway that links with other partners in the wider precinct
- A model for shared clinical decision making that is underpinned by data

LONG-TERM GOAL BEYOND 2023

- Increase external research funding across our partners by 20%
- 5% of patients participate in a clinical trial
- Every clinician has the opportunity to be involved in research projects
- A single point of entry for all research and clinical trials across the partners
- A demonstrated efficient and transparent commercialisation partnership model
- Secure access to ethically controlled health information that informs clinical practice on a day-to-day basis



Our initial projects for 2021 - 2023

The strength of AHIP is to bring together the key elements, knowledge and skills from our partner organisations to tackle projects that will have significant impact on improving health for our community. There are 5 initial projects underway. In time, additional projects will commence.

Centre of Excellence for Aboriginal health

The Centre of Excellence for Aboriginal health will improve access and increase the provision of world-class healthcare to the Aboriginal population of South Australia

Shared Research Service

A shared research service will provide a single point of entry for researchers and industry, streamline processes and fast track approvals to support researchers to start and manage projects more efficiently

Bragg Comprehensive Cancer Centre (BCCC)

The BCCC will provide research-driven, consumer-informed cancer research, education and patient care so that South Australians receive the most advanced world-class care

Artificial Intelligence (AI) and data in health

Removing barriers to data access and linkage so that it can be used to inform artificial intelligence (AI) projects and support better data-driven clinical decision making. All AI projects will be mapped and an AI plan for AHIP will be developed.

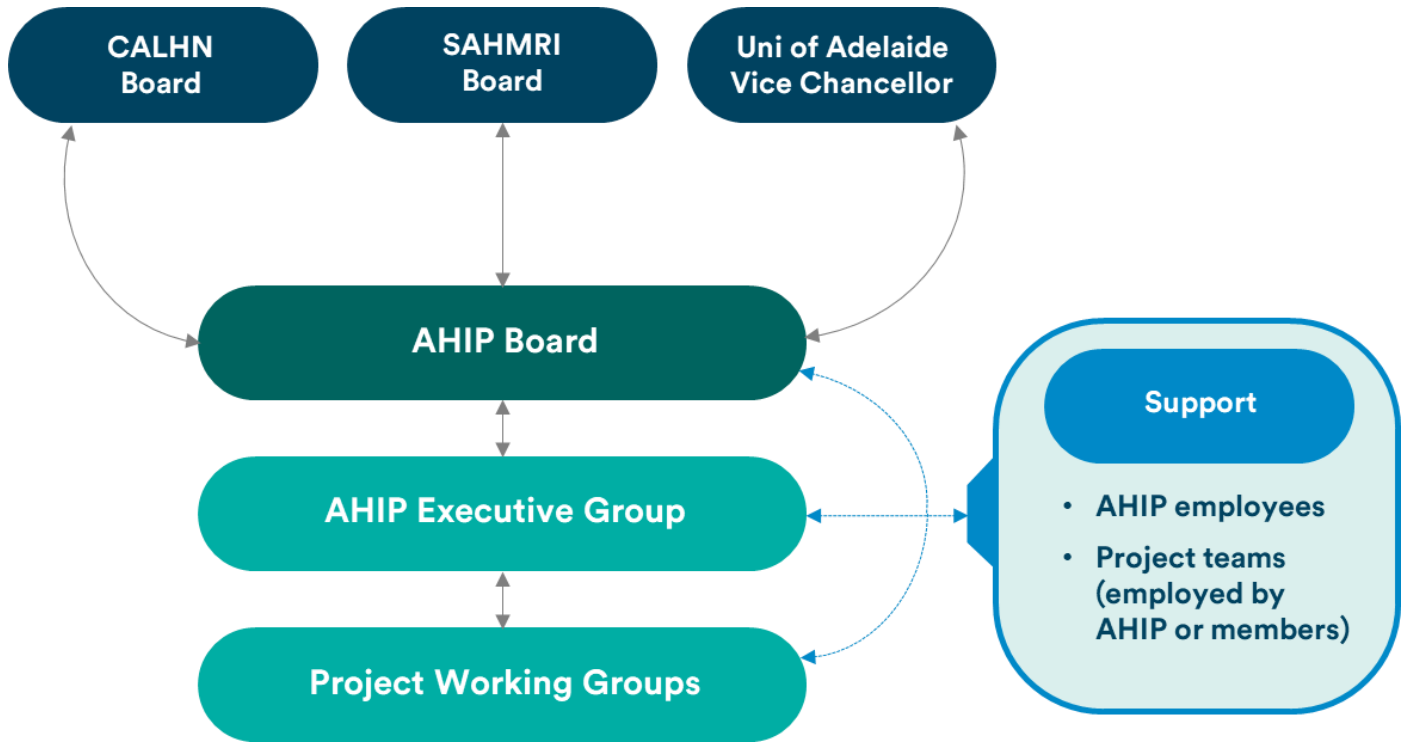
Integrated Clinical Trials
